The built environment is central to the quality of life for everyone, everywhere.

In 2008, 50% of the world's population lived in urban areas. By 2050 this is likely to grow to 70 per cent. However with urban growth we see the urbanization of poverty and the development of slum cities, with poverty growing faster in cities than in rural areas.

However, through urbanization China has succeeded in lifting many hundreds of millions of people out of poverty. Urbanization has been an engine of economic growth, which in turn has created unprecedented growth in consumption and living standards in little more than 30 years.

Raising standards of living has the consequence of increasing greenhouse gases and many other kinds of pollution. Whilst the carbon dioxide produced per capita in China remains significantly lower than in the west, with the USA at four times the level of China, as a nation China leads in the production of greenhouse gases.

It is now recognized that between 40 and 50 per cent of carbon dioxide emissions are associated with buildings and what we do in them. In the UK 27 per cent of carbon dioxide generation comes from our homes. The requirement for the construction industry to reduce emissions in new and existing buildings will be the biggest challenge of the first half of the 21st century.

The theme of Shanghai Expo, 'Better Cities; Better Life', challenges the construction industry to tackle these profound issues. CIOB Global Construction Summit, Shanghai 2010 - Building Better Cities, East Meets West is inextricably bound up with finding sustainable solutions to the new challenges facing us.

This CIOB conference will address the political, economic and industrial themes in 'Building Better Cities', as well as the personal challenges facing professionals in the construction industry.

Li Shirong - Deputy Director General of Chongqing Foreign Trade & Economic Relations Commission, FCIOB, FRICS, FICE

Professor Li was responsible for promotion of foreign investment as Deputy Director of Chongqing Foreign Trade & Economic Relations Commission. From 2003 to 2006, she was the Vice Mayor of local government Shapingba District for urban development and construction. She was also assigned as the President CIOB between 2009 and 2010, at the same time she is a part-time professor of Chongqing University. Professor Li played a crucial role in the promotion of the 'Sustainable Cities' Project and signing of MoU between the UK and Chongqing government. She is also a key player in collaboration between UK professional institutions and Chongqing government in the establishment of the Sino-British Professional Center which is an important part of the signed MOU. She was listed as one of the top 50 people who have influence on the UK construction industry by Construction



The Rt Hon John Prescott - Former Deputy Prime Minister UK, Former Secretary of State for Environment, Transport and the Regions, and Co-Chair of the UK-China Taskforce

Mr Prescott was was the MP for Hull East from 1970 -2010, holding many key positions in government and was Deputy Prime Minister and First Secretary of State for Environment, Transport and the Regions and Local Government. Mr. Prescott played a key role at Kyoto as a European negotiator, working closely with Vice President Al Gore of America to secure an agreement. He is the former co-chair and member of The UK-China Task Force, together with State Councilor Tang. He remains a member of the UK-China Task Force and working hard to forge close links between the two countries particularly to tackle climate change through the Sustainable Cities concept and the development of new clean coal technologies. He is an honorary professor on climate change at Xiamen University.



Yi Jun - President of CIOB China, Chairman of China State Construction Engineering Co., Ltd., FCIOB

Mr. Yi graduated from Chongqing Construction University and joined China State Construction Engineering Corp. (CSCEC) in 1982. From March 1986 to July 1987, Mr. Yi Jun took courses on Project Management in Cardiff University. From September 1997 to September 1999, he studied in Chongqing Construction University and obtained a master degree on Engineering Management. Now Mr. Yi Jun is a Professor Senior Engineer and National Project Manager. He is also honored to be FCIOB, Vice Chairman of China Construction Industry Association, Vice Chairman of China Association of Construction Enterprise Management, Vice Chairman of Foreign Contracting Committee, Vice Chairman of National Enterprise Youth Federation, President CIOB China, and Vice Chairman of CATIS. Except these honors, Mr. Yi Jun has obtained many awards such as National Excellent Project Manager and National Labor Model.



Sun Jiwei - Mayor of Shanghai Jiading District People's Government, Vice President CIOB China, FCIOB

Mr. Sun is Mayor of Shanghai Jiading District People's Government, in charge of economy, construction and social development. From 1997 to 2000 Mr. Sun was Deputy Director of Construction Committee of Luwan District in charge of urban construction and reconstruction of old areas. From 2003 to 2006, Mr. Sun took on the role as Deputy Mayor of Qingpu District for urban construction and management. He actively promoted the urban construction in Qingpu District. His 'Qingpu Practice' has exerted extensive influence on domestic and international construction industry.



Ding Hao - Deputy Director of Shanghai World Expo Affairs Coordination Bureau, Deputy Commander of Expo Construction Command, MCIOB

Mr. Ding is currently responsible for the construction of the Expo projects. He has previoulsy acted as the Deputy Director General of Shanghai Urban Construction and Transportation Commission in charge of construction management on many important projects in Shanghai. He has also held the position of Deputy General Manager of Shanghai Light Source Project. Mr. Ding has also acted as the Deputy General Manager of Shanghai Construction Group and was responsible for construction management. His Project Management experience has seen Mr. Ding manage many high-profile projects including Pudong Airport Terminal Buildings, Henglong Plaza, and International Convention Centre.



Xu Jieliang - Deputy Director General of Shanghai Urban Construction and Transportation Commission, Deputy Commander of the Dujiangyan Reconstruction Headquarters, MCIOB

Mr. Xu was mainly responsible for the post-earthquake reconstruction work on transportation systems in municipal and rural areas of Dujiangyan. Since June 1992, Mr. Xu has successively acted as the Deputy General Manager of Shanghai Second Construction Engineering Co., Ltd. Since June 2002, he has been the Director of Shanghai Bidding Office. From Feb 2004, he successively took on the Director of Building Material Division of Shanghai Construction and Transportation Commission and Director of Shanghai Bidding Office. From May 2005 to Dec 2006, he served as the Director of Construction Management Division of Shanghai Urban Construction and Transportation commission and Director of Shanghai Bidding Office. From 2006 to 2008, he served as the Director of Construction Management Division of Shanghai Urban Construction and Transportation Commission.
